I have been Head Cook here at RSS for over 20 years – Where did the time go? Cooking is my passion. Growing up in Ghana, I have wonderful memories of cooking with my mother as a young child, this is where my love of cooking began. Coming to America is where I honed my professional skills in cooking. I was trained at the New York institute of Dietetics Inc. in commercial cooking and catering. After my training I worked for several hospitality institutions. I also did private catering parties on my own

before joining RSS. Meeting your needs and all the many different preferences is a both a challenge and my pleasure. I thought you might be interested in some of the processes that take place to ensure your dining experience is a good one.

The NYC Department for the Aging (DFTA) oversees everything that happens in the kitchen. This includes making sure we serve food at the proper temperature, using the correct kitchen equipment, serving food properly in the dining room, maintaining a clean kitchen and complying with the many food safety regulations. DFTA also requires that the components and each meal contain the correct amount of calories and the right kind of vitamins. Supplies are checked to ensure low salt content and no trans-fats. DFTA provides us with many menu choices from which we must choose. Once they are chosen we send a semi-annual plan (6 month plan) for approval. We are given some leeway to serve extra items such as a cake and ice cream for special occasions.

Speaking of special occasions I'd like to ask your help in ensuring that everyone gets a meal on our many celebrations and that no one is turned away. Please make sure to **sign up in advance** as required so that I can make sure to order the correct amount of food. We also try to make sure there are enough staff and volunteers to serve you in a timely manner.

Another behind the scenes effort is handled by the menu committee who help to make the menu choices fresh and varied. Anyone can be a member of the committee and all are welcome to make suggestions in the suggestion box. There is always room for improvement!

The next menu committee meeting will be posted in the May calendar.

I thank you for the many compliments you have given to me and to the kitchen staff.

April 5-Moonlight



A young man deals with his dysfunctional home life and comes of age in Miami during the War on Drugs era. The story of his struggle to find himself is told across three defining chapters in his life as he experiences the ecstasy, pain, and beauty of falling in love, while grappling with his own sexuality.

April 12-Jackie



Jacqueline Kennedy was just 34 when her husband was elected President of the United States. Elegant, stylish, and inscrutable, she instantly became a global JACKIE icon, one of the most famous women in the world, her taste in fashion, décor and the arts widely admired. Then, on November 22, 1963, while on a campaign trip to Dallas, John F. Kennedy is assassinated – Jackie's pink suit is showered in her

husband's blood. As she boards Air Force One back to Washington, Jackie's world – and her faith – is completely shattered. Traumatized and reeling with grief, over the course of the next week she must confront the unimaginable: consoling their two young children, vacating the home she painstakingly restored, and planning her husband's funeral. Jackie quickly realizes that the next seven days will determine how history will define her husband's legacy and how she herself will be remembered.

Five-year-old Siro gets lost on a train which takes him thousands of miles across India, away from home and family. Siro must learn to survive alone in Kolkata, before ultimately being adopted by an Australian couple.
